Braeview School is classified as Category 6 on the Department for Education Index of Educational Disadvantage. At the time of this report, the school population includes 2% Aboriginal students, 14% students with disabilities, 1% children/young people in care. Governing Council Report

Braeview School Governing Council Chairpersons Report 2025

The Braeview Governing Council had a very successful year in 2025, we continued to collaborate with and support the Principal, teachers and staff, and the entire school community to continue driving Braeview School in a positive direction for the future.

Braeview made the move to outsource their OSHC program to Our Patch in 2025 and school leadership and the governing council have worked closely with existing OSHC staff, families and Our Patch to ensure any questions and teething issues were worked through swiftly. We are happy to report that the program is running smoothly and is continuing to be an important source of support for working families in our school community.

With the erection of the new school fence in 2025, to ensure the safety of our students, the school and governing council worked hard with the department of education on updating important policies and procedures around "Emergency Evacuation and Invacuations" within Braeview School. The new policies have been released and practiced by staff and students.

The school community and governing council fundraising efforts in 2025 were phenomenal. We had an opening balance carried forward from 2024 of \$28,506.36 and we had many successful fundraising events in 2025 including the following: Sports Day BBQ, Election Day BBQ, Mother's Day Stall and Raffle, Easter Raffle, Father's Day Stall, Mini Fete, and Christmas @ Braeview BBQ.

The governing council also subsidised many events in 2025 to benefit our students and families including: Yr6 Aquatics Day, R-5 Swimming Week, Special Options Gymnastics Program, Library Animal Displays, Holiday Reading Challenge and State SAPSASA Representative.

The spectacular efforts of our volunteers and community meant that even after expenses and subsidies were considered, we still made \$10,842.18 which meant we have a closing balance to take into 2026 of \$39,348.54.

As chair of the governing council, I would like to thank my vice Kelly Smart for your unwavering support in 2025, and I'd also like to thank every member of the governing council alongside school staff and leadership and the broader school community. Without the time and effort of our volunteers, the previously mentioned fundraising efforts simply could not be achieved.

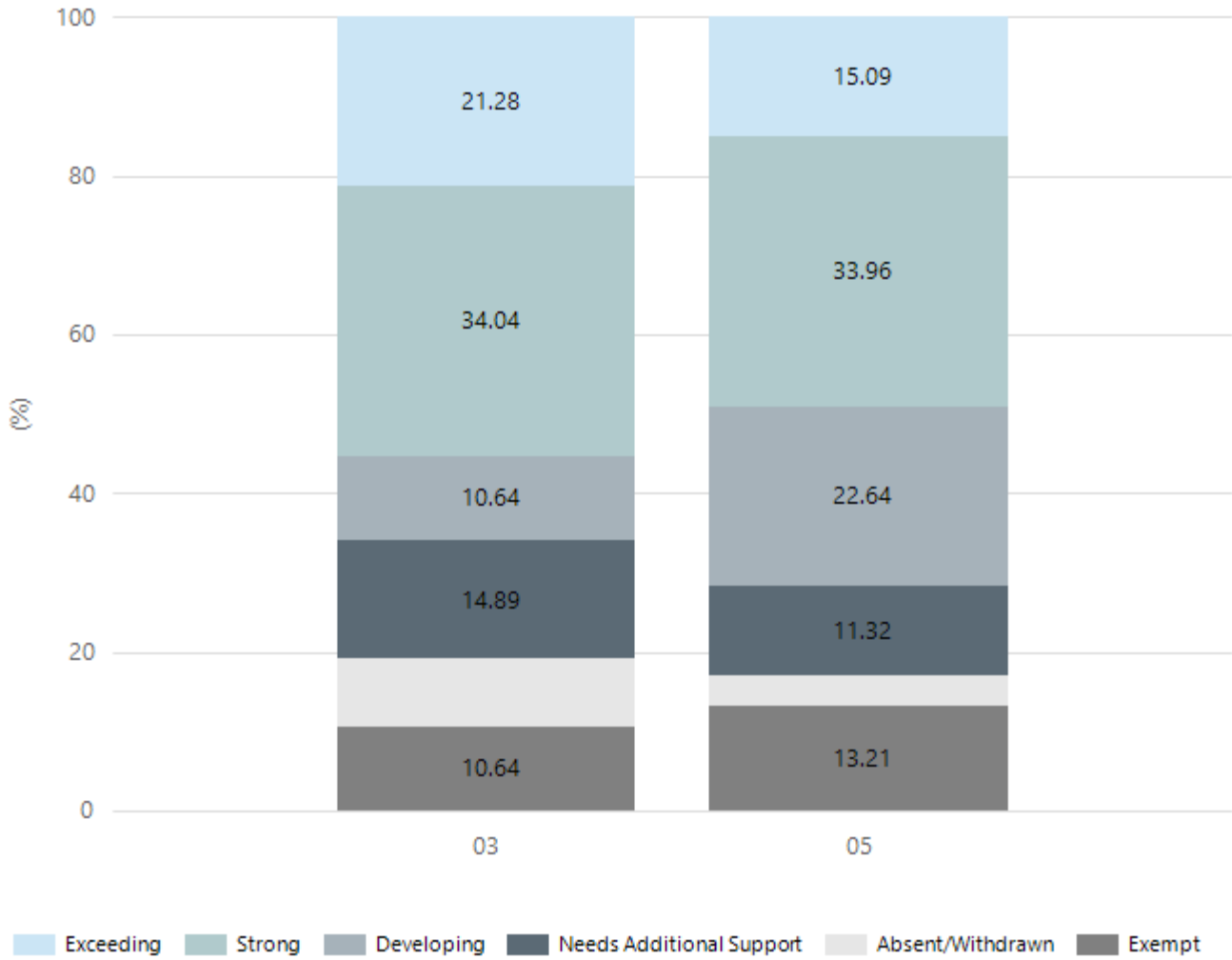

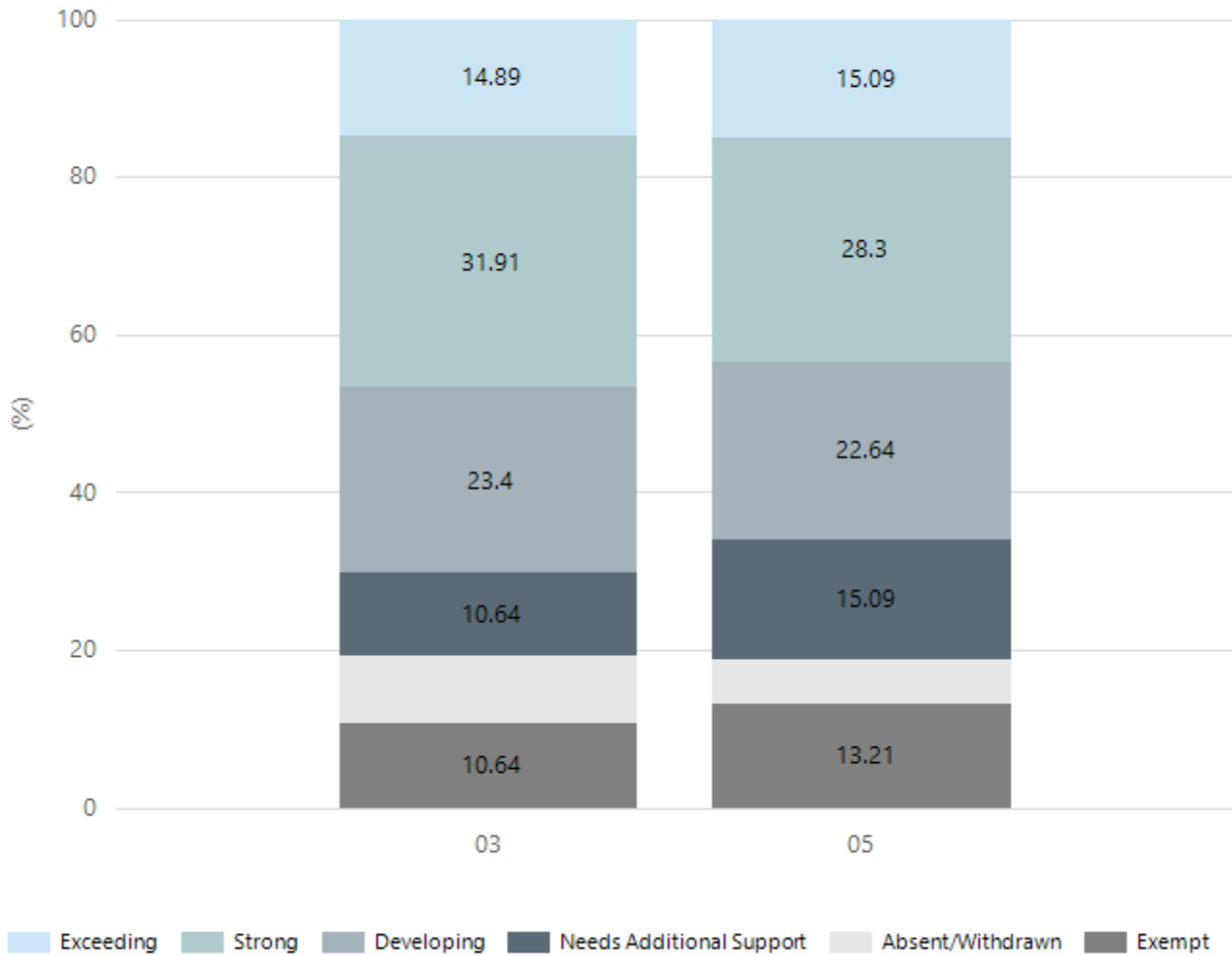

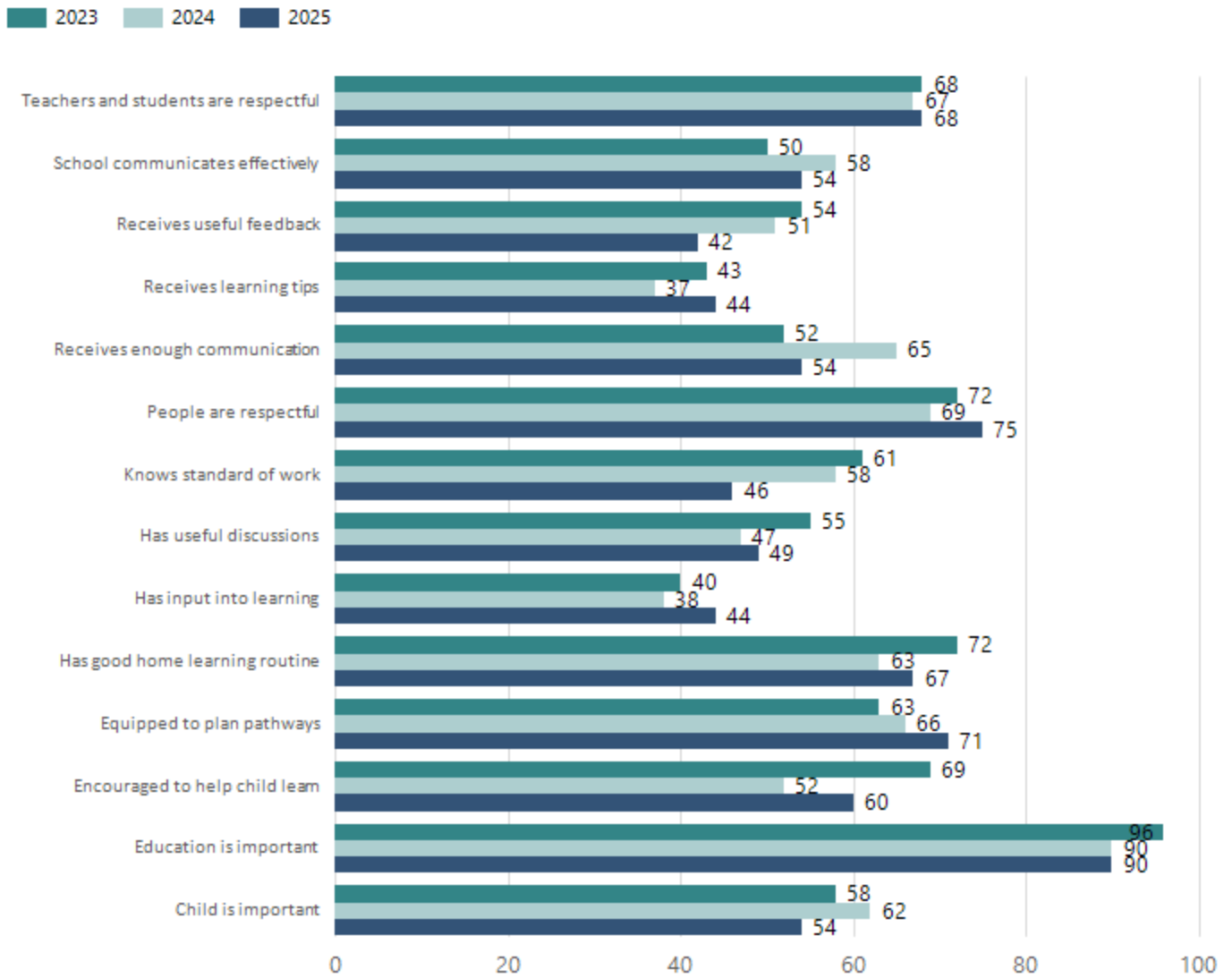

Attendance Comment

In South Australia, all children and young people must be in school from 6 years to 16 years old. They must attend a government or non-government school full time. From age 16 to 17 however, young people must attend school or an approved learning program (such as an apprenticeship, traineeship, accredited course or university). Schools and parents must encourage and support students to come to school every day. Parents and caregivers must make sure their child is enrolled in a school, and attends school all day and everyday it is open, unless a child is sick or has an approved exemption. Teachers and leaders actively follow up when a student misses school, including recording all absences and non-attendance. All schools in South Australia have local attendance procedures governed under the Education and Children's Services Regulations 2020.
